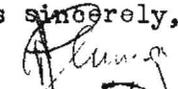
Dear Member,

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 1959

1. The AGM was held at Southover on 19 Jun 1959. Items 1, 2, 3, and 4 were quickly disposed of, the Chairman requesting members present to do their utmost to increase the strength of the Association.
2. A very full report on the negotiations with the Old Finchleians Club was given, leading up to the proposed Agreement between the Association and Club, approval to which was recommended by the Executive Committee.
3. The proposed agreement evoked considerable discussion and many interesting, and indeed revealing, 'home-truths' expressed. There is obviously much apprehension over the proposed move; but the bulk of members present realised that the Association possessed little alternative but to become a Section and that certain advantages might conceivably accrue from incorporation. The motion for acceptance of the agreement was carried by a large majority. Section I (d) of the agreement was, however, deleted as this required an alteration in the Association's rules and the vote in favour of the agreement did not. The vote in favour of this item did not find the necessary two-thirds majority - the proportion required to amend, waive or alter a rule.
4. It was decided to authorise the Executive Committee to deal with the nomination and appointment of a President and Vice-Presidents.
5. The new Executive Committee was elected, as under, with powers to co-opt:-

An additional item was the report by the Chairman of the history of the opposition by the Association to the proposal by Finchley Borough Council to reduce Christ's College to a two form entry School, a move which would have severe detrimental effects upon the School, the Contingent and the Association.
