On Friday, 22 November 1957, a group of former Cadets met to form a Regimental Association of former members of Christs College Cadet Corps. The need for such an Association has long been felt and ideas on the subject have frequently been put forward over the last few years.

The objects of the Association are felt to be two-fold. Primarily it is founded to bring together past members of the Cadet Corps who, it is felt, will have retained many memories of the comradeship of their service and will welcome an opportunity to be able to meet once more all those with whom they served. An informal Annual Dinner has been suggested and also a regular Re-union to be held locally. It is also intended to produce a regular news-letter to assist members to maintain contact with former Cadets now scattered throughout the world.

A secondary object will be to foster and encourage the continuance of the Cadet unit at Christs College and to assist by all possible means in the activities of the present unit.

Membership is invited from all former members of the Cadet Corps who have left school and it has been decided that the joining subscription shall be 7/6 and the annual subscription 5/-. These have been kept as low as possible, but the Association intends to issue its own journal to members in addition to the newsletter and the subscription will therefore leave only a small balance for administrative costs.

The Association is in no way intended as an alternative to the Old Finchleian Club (the majority of founder members are members of the Club), but rather as an additional organisation to serve the interests of its members who have a common interest in recalling their past service and a wish to renew old friendships.

The following founder members have constituted themselves as an Executive Committee to form the Association and to serve until the first Annual General Meeting.
